Dear Friends,

Happy New Year!

Thank you for reading my newsletter. It has been a good while since I have produced anything, so

this edition contains some highlights on my work.

As I write, I am now in my second year of ministerial training. The first year was good, but hard. The course is demanding and asks a lot from us. I am training with a mix of Anglicans and Methodists and we are the largest group of students that Queen's have had for years! (13 Methodist & 14 Anglican). It is encouraging!



Part-time study involves weekly lessons online, travel to Birmingham every six weeks or so and some independent learning. I have had to write lots of essays

which I have found tricky after being out of education for so long. In the summer, I was on placement in the Sunderland Circuit. That was a good experience and it was great to see what happens in another Circuit. While in Sunderland, I got to visit a Mosque and a Gurdwara and meet other faith leaders as part of the inter-faith network. Seeing how that group support each other was great.

## Introducing Discover and Discover+

Since the pandemic, we have been running an online church group for children. Sessions include games, crafts, songs, prayers and learning about faith. Over the years we have seen children grow in confidence and in their faith journey. The group has also helped equip volunteers with skills for leading all-age talks in church services.

The group has been rebranded and Junior Church on Zoom has become Discover. It is a space where children can come to discover fun, friendship and faith.

Along with this, Discover has expanded, and Discover+ has launched. This is an older Discover group, open for young people in Year 6 and above. In Discover+, young people will be able to explore faith at a deeper level. This term, sessions have been themed on Pixar, with Pixar Short Films being used.

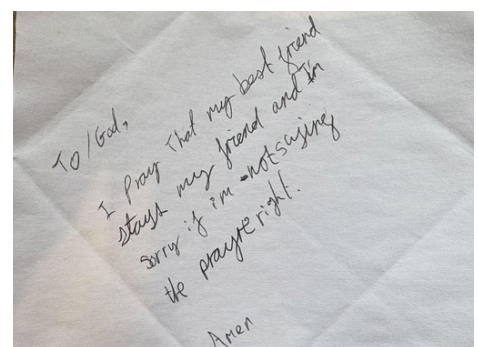
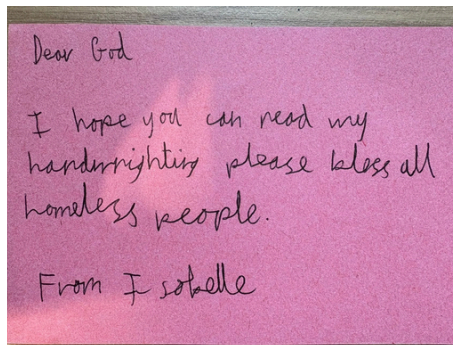
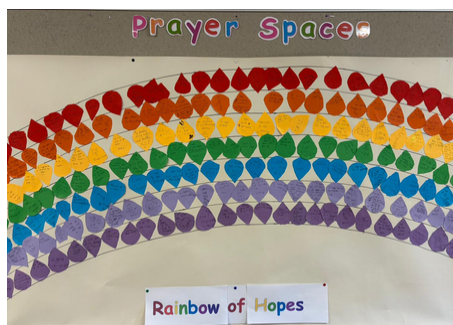
## Prayer Spaces in Schools develops and grows

Much time is being spent in schools running Prayer Spaces in Schools sessions with ecumenical teams. Throughout the year, regular slots happened at Ryton Juniors, Emmaville Primary and Greenside Primary.

At Ryton, a highlight in 2025 was running an outdoor session in the Forest School area.

It was great to relaunch the sessions at Greenside school and strengthen connections there. A highlight at Greenside was a child explaining how she felt that she was 'half a Christian'. Then, encouraged by Prayer Spaces, this child asked to connect with church and she attended the holiday club at Strathmore Road.

This year, team members have enjoyed training to develop skills. In it, they heard how Prayer Spaces in Schools aim to enable children and young people, of all faiths and none, to explore life's questions, spirituality and faith in a safe, creative and interactive way.

## School Visits

Sam has had the pleasure of supporting churches with local school visits. At Unity Church, they welcome Riverside Primary Academy to Ravensworth Road regularly. Once or twice a year, the whole school visit the church class by class and engage in the activities arranged. During the last visit, Sam and Brigitta shared the 'Ten Best Ways' Godly Play Story. Before that, there was an Easter experience and a Christmas experience, where children journeyed through the stories. At the latest visit, a member of the school staff shared how much they love to visit the church and how they feel like they are part of the family. At the Easter experience, a highlight for Sam was sharing the resurrection part of the story with reception children. When Sam opened the tomb and explained that Jesus was gone, the children

when wow! They were so amazed! It reminded Sam of how amazing the Easter story is and to hold onto that sense of wow.

Last term, the Christmas Experience was replicated at Fellside Church and Sam helped the team there and three schools engaged with that. Teachers commented on how wonderful it was and hoped there would more activities in the near future.
