Keeping Premature Babies Warm with Fellside's Current Scheme

For four months Fellside are supporting a charity providing premature babies with woollen hats for our local hospitals.

The hats are vital to help newborns regulate their temperature during their hospital stays. Often shop-bought hats are just too big for premature babies so these knitted hats are the perfect size.

The pattern can be found on Fellside Church's website www.fellside.co.uk or in the foyer of the church, where there is also a box to drop off the finished hats.

Once you have the pattern you will need a ball of double knit wool and two sized needles: 3 1/4mm and 4mm.

Donations from the whole community are welcome so please pass the pattern on to anyone interested in knitting!

Letter from the Superintendent

Inspiration can be found in unexpected places! I was reminded of this at a meeting of the church treasurers from around the Circuit earlier this week. We had gathered to look at the Circuit budget for the coming year, and how we will resource that together. Not the most inspirational of topics, you might think!

In January 2022 the treasurers' meeting had acknowledged the struggles of the previous eighteen months for all our churches, and the uncertainty we all felt about the future. However, this year there were already signs of hope to be seen, in the information provided to the Circuit before the meeting: new members made at some of our churches; greater attendance at worship in other places, compared to before the pandemic; and an increase in giving elsewhere.

This year we began the meeting by taking time to think about 2022. All those present were asked to share something from the life of the church for which we could give thanks to God. I wonder how you would respond if asked.

As we went around the room, some gave thanks for new ventures: Brick Church: exploring the Bible through Lego; and Singing for the Brain; others spoke of Warm Spaces open weekly to welcome members of the community. We rejoiced as we heard about new people coming to worship and closer links with community groups.

Before we moved on to look at the finance, we gave thanks to God for 'green shoots' emerging in the life of our churches. I suggested that this is why we do what we do, giving our time, talents and money so that others can hear the good news of Jesus, through word and deed.

Since the meeting I have continued to reflect on our shared experience at that meeting. I am reminded of the words of the prophet Isaiah, who wrote 'See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the desert and streams in the wasteland.' (Isaiah 43: 19)

This morning I noticed the first signs of snowdrops breaking through the soil in the garden. Just a small sign but an important one, that the winter will come to an end with the promise of spring to come. In the same way the green shoots of new life in our



churches are a sign that God is a work, bringing us into a new season that will bear fruit in the months and years to come.


Burnopfield Supporting Ukranians with Link to Hope
